

Intensive English Program Sponsor Form

If you are an international student who will get an F-1 visa, you must show bank documents that show you can pay living and studying costs in the U.S. The bank document can be in your name OR the name of the person who will pay for your costs (your sponsor). Your bank document should be a letter. **The bank letter should:**

- Be in English or have English translation attached
- Be on official bank stationary with the address, phone number of the bank branch
- Be signed AND stamped by bank officials
- Have your name or your sponsor's name, the account number, and account open date
- Say the type of account (You CANNOT use investment accounts, mutual funds, etc.)
- Be recent (no more than 6 months old)
- Show the currency (Dollar, Peso, Riyal, Franc, etc)
- Show at least \$24,500 to cover your costs (add \$4500 if you will bring your husband/wife, add \$2500 for each child that will you come with you)
